# 7. LONERS & INTERNATIONALISTS MEMBERS

- **A.** The purpose of LIM is to provide a way for Loners who live in remote areas where there are no A.A. meetings to correspond with others in similar situations. Internationalists, members whose work involves long stretches on seagoing vessels, also participate. The service works well for Homers, members who are homebound, usually because of physical problems or disability.

# 8. WORLD HELLO, POSTAL MAIL MEETINGS

- **A.** World Hello is a closed international AA group that meets via the postal mail through a quarterly published newsletter. Members send their share on a suggested topic, that is then printed for the rest of the group to read (by group conscience, members must write the editor at least every 6 months to retain membership in the group). Each member then picks others to write to individually (akin to pen pals, but more like after meeting chat only via the mail).
- **B.** We have been together as a group since 1956. We operate just like a regular meeting, self supporting and also send donations to GSO. Our group members can volunteer for service positions that are posted through the newsletter.
- **C.** A sample copy of the latest newsletter, Meeting-By-Mail, can be sent to you. If what you read interests you and you want to join, the following information will be required:
- 1. Your date of sobriety
- 2. A brief hello from you, which will serve as your initial share and intro to the rest of the group,
- 3. Your name and address.

### 1. HOW TO ACCESS ONLINE MEETINGS

- A. Enter the address www.aa-intergroup.org into a browser
- **B.** Click on "Online Meetings" to go to the Online Meetings directory page.
- **C.** Click on the format of your choice: Email, Chat (text), Audio/Visual, Discussion Forums or Telephone. The details for using each format is described in Section 2-6 below.
- **D.** By default, all meetings are shown. You can narrow your choices by clicking on the specific links listed after the format choices.
- **E.** Meetings are also available in other languages by clicking on the specific language link.

### 2. EMAIL MEETINGS

- **A.** There are many English language meetings listed by either a link or an email address.
- **B.** Each meeting has a brief description and a field to complete or a link for joining.
- **C.** Some meetings require that you join either Google or Yahoo Groups (not difficult)
- **D.** Below is a sample email response to a request to join a meeting named 12and12. The registration process will vary from meeting to meeting.

# 3. CHAT(TEXT) MEETINGS

- **A.** There are numerous chat meetings listed.
- **B.** The process for joining is similar to joining an email meeting.
- **C.** Many Chat Meetings are ongoing, 24-7 meetings. There is often a list of members who are participating at a particular time.

## 4. AUDIO/VISUAL MEETINGS

- **A.** There are numerous audio/visual meetings listed.
- **B.** You need a Skype ID to participate.
- **C.** wikihow.com gives directions for creating a Skype Account.
- **D.** AAOnlinemeetings.net gives directions for joining an audio/visual group, including creating a Skype ID.

### 5. DISCUSSION FORUMS

- **A.** There are numerous discussion forums listed.
- **B.** Some list days and times that the meetings occur; others will provide this information once you register.
- C. Some require that you join Google or Yahoo groups.
- **D.** Registration is similar to signing up for an email meeting.

### 6. TELEPHONE MEETINGS

- **A.** There are numerous telephone meetings listed.
- **B.** Many of the meetings list a phone number and an access code.
- C. Specific times are sometimes listed.
- **D.** An email address is provided by each meeting to assist you with connecting if you are having difficulty or if you want more information about the group.
